" Extract of the Plymouth Patent. viz.

" All that Tract of Land or Part of New-England in AMERICA aforefaid, which lieth "within or between and extendeth itfelf from the utmost Limits of Cobbetfecontee alias "Comafecontee, which adjoineth to the River of Kenebeck, alias Kennebechite, towards the "Western Ocean, and a Place called the Falls at Nequumbite in AMERICA aforefaid, and the Space of Fifteen English Miles on each Side faid River commonly called Kennebeck River, and all the faid River called Kennebeck that lieth within the faid Limits and Bounds, "Eastward, Westward, Northward and Southward, last above mentioned, and all Lands, "Grants, Soils, Rivers, Waters, Fishings, Hereditaments and Profits whatever, fituate "lying and being, arising, happening or accrueing, or which shall arise, happen or accrue in or within the faid Limits or Bounds or either of them; Together with free Ingress, "Egress and Regress with Ships, Boats, Shallops or other Vessels, from the Sea commonly called the Western Ocean to the faid River called Kennebeck, and from faid River to the faid Western Ocean, together with all Prerogatives, Rights, Royalties, Jurisdicti-"ons &cc.-----
