


# Maine HIV Diagnoses, January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2013

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Between January 1<sup>st</sup> and December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2013, 39 newly diagnosed HIV cases were reported to the Maine CDC. Demographic data provided in the table below show that men who have sex with other men are disproportionately affected by HIV in Maine. While most diagnoses were seen in the 40-49 year age range, new diagnoses were reported in people <1-60 years of age. Of the 39 newly reported HIV cases, nine (9) of those also received an AIDS diagnosis within 1 month of testing positive for HIV. There were a total of 30 AIDS cases diagnosed in Maine in 2013. Current records indicate that 1,706<sup>†</sup> of Maine's residents are infected with HIV. The table below presents demographic data for newly diagnosed and prevalent HIV cases in Maine.

<sup>‡</sup>Maine CDC estimates that HIV/AIDS reporting is 95% complete. 1,796 Mainers may therefore be living with diagnosed HIV/AIDS in 2013 (an estimated 90 individuals with an HIV diagnosis remain unreported).
