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
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SAGADAHOC COUNTY: 1992

Health Care Resources

- Physicians: 43 physicians (MD and DO) indicated that they were practicing in Sagadahoc county; 58% of these physicians (25) reported practicing in a primary care* specialty; a percentage significantly greater than the national percentage of 47%.
- Registered Nurses: There were 154 registered nurses practicing their profession in Sagadahoc county resulting in a nurse to physician ratio of 3.6 nurses for every doctor; this compares to the national rate of 3 nurses per doctor.
- Dentists: 10 dentists reported working in Sagadahoc county. The resulting ratio of .3 dentists for every 1,000 residents is significantly less than the national ratio of .6/1,000. The state ratio is .4 dentists for every 1,000 residents.
- Hospitals: There was 1 hospital in Sagadahoc county with a total of 55 general use hospital beds. This yielded a county ratio of 1.6 general use hospital beds per 1,000 residents (the third lowest rate in the state) and significantly lower than the national ratio of 4.0/1,000. Statewide the ratio was 3.5 per 1,000.

Nursing Homes: There were 2 long term care facilities with 141 nursing home beds in 1992; this represented a county ratio of 39 nursing home beds per 1,000 elderly population - significantly lower than the nationwide ratio of 48 beds per 1,000 elderly.
