
Health Status Indicators

- **→** Population: In 1992, the population of Sagadahoc county was 33,963, making it Maine's 13th most populous county.
- → Population Aged 65 and Older: In 1992, 3,644 county residents were 65 years old or older, about 11% of the county population, significantly less than the national average of 12.7% The state average was 14%.

- **→** Births: There were 487 births to residents of Sagadahoc county; this yielded a county birth rate of 14.3 births for every 1,000 residents, the state's second highest rate.
- Adolescent births (10-17 years old): 3.9% of all live births in this county were to adolescent mothers; this compares to the national figure of 3.8%.
- Low birth weight babies: In Sagadahoc county, 4.7% of all live births resulted in babies weighing less than 2500 grams (5 1/2 pounds). This was significantly less than the national figure of 5.8%.
- Deaths: There were 253 deaths to county residents in 1992. The age-adjusted death rate*, 5.0, compares to the national rate of 4.9.

Infant Deaths**: The county infant death rate was 6.4 deaths per 1,000 live births; this was <u>significantly less</u> than the national rate of 7.3 deaths.

* 1991 age-adjusted death rates are for underlying cause of death, U.S. rates are for whites only; rates are age adjusted to the US 1940 standard population; these are rates that have been standardized to eliminate differences due solely to variations in the age composition of the populations.
