

In two Maine counties, Oxford and Piscataguis, the ratio of residents to each physician increased between 1986 and 1996, i.e., there were more residents for each physician to serve in 1996 than there were in 1986.



- ► The average age of allopathic physicians was 49 years in 1996 compared to 46 years for their osteopathic counterparts.
- The age distribution of professionals within these two physician groups was similar in 1986; however, by 1996 the differences were pronounced with a flattening of the curve for allopaths (a more even distribution amongst age groups) and a marked spike in the 35 - 44 year old group for osteopaths (a 10% increase in this age group).
